

# palmitoylation of eNOS

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## Introduction

Reactome is open-source, open access, manually curated and peer-reviewed pathway database. DHHC-21 is a Golgi-localized acyl transferase that palmitoylates eNOS, which targets eNOS to plasmalemmal caveolae. Localization to this microdomain is likely to optimize eNOS activation and the extracellular release of nitric oxide.
